Mollie is deeply grateful for her home, her work as a part time caregiver, and for Faith Family which, as she puts it, "has allowed me to be able to run this race." She came to the Clinic with a serious pre-existing condition. She knew it was crucial to monitor her disease.

Faith Family's affordable fees have made it possible for her to successfully manage her illness.

Passionate in her faith and reliance on God, Mollie is also enthusiastic about the care she has experienced at Faith Family. She sees Faith Family as just one more way God is taking care of her and describes it as "a beautiful place".

"You can't leave with low self-esteem because they build you up," she adds. "They give you dignity."

RENOVATION PLANS FOR THE CLINIC

As Faith Family approaches its eighth birthday, our clinic is busier than ever. We are delighted to report that we are beginning to renovate a few areas of our clinic to allow for better patient flow and increased efficiency.

The reconfiguration will create four private workspaces for nurse practitioners and physicians. This is an important improvement that will give these dedicated staff members a place to chart and return calls to patients. The renovation will also create an additional exam room, bringing the total to six. Lastly, our medical chart files will be moved which will open up our front reception area and will result in an additional check-in/check-out counter.

We are eager to see how the renovation will enhance our day to day work. Ultimately, we know these investments in our physical space will also be investments in the people we serve.



Training a New Wave of Health Care Professionals

In a typical year, between 25 and 30 aspiring nurses, nurse practitioners, and doctors are mentored by Faith Family practitioners through internships or other training programs. We are pleased to introduce you to one recent Faith Family intern: Kelly Tschida

On a regular basis, Faith Family receives the help of energetic and capable nursing and medical interns. This summer, we were grateful for assistance from several interns, including Kelly Tschida. A former Peace Corps volunteer with a background in business, Kelly has a deep interest in helping people, a commitment which recently led him to pursue a second career as a nurse practitioner. He is currently completing his studies at Vanderbilt and was assigned to Faith Family for his 280-hour clinical rotation.

The patient population at Faith Family was a good fit for Kelly, since his long-term plans include providing health care to the underserved. "It was a great place to get lots of practical experience," says Kelly of his six week rotation. "The physicians, nurse practitioners and physician's assistant are excellent role models," Kelly adds. "They are influencing a whole group of students through the loving care they model for us."

Kelly was struck by how an important part of the compassionate care provided at Faith Family comes in the form of attentive listening. "They are more concerned with helping people than hurrying patients through the clinic," says Kelly, of the Faith Family team. "I loved being there to see how people work in that kind of system and how it is so beneficial for everyone involved."

In September, Kelly will return to Africa, this time to Rwanda where he has a fellowship at a hospital for a few months. Afterwards, he plans to either continue working in Africa as a nurse practitioner, or return to the Western United States where he is interested in working for Indian Health Services. We are grateful to Kelly for touching our lives and the lives of our patients this summer, and wish him well in the next step of his journey.

Staff Spotlight

Becky Eagle

Office Assistant & Patient Assistance Coordinator at FFMC since February, 2003

Becky Eagle's path to Faith Family began almost 10 years ago when she started volunteering at a local healthcare clinic. For four years, Becky provided clerical help one evening a week. After being laid off from her job in advertising, Becky reconsidered what kind of job she wanted to pursue and realized that her work at the clinic provided the meaning she wanted in her next job. What at first seemed like a dream quickly became reality. Through the help of a board member, she found herself being offered a recently vacated position at Faith Family.

During the six years Becky has been at the clinic, she has filled a variety of administrative positions. Her primary responsibility presently is to administer the Patient Assistance Program, which involves processing the paperwork for qualified patients to obtain free medicine from pharmaceutical companies. Although the clinic providers prescribe the affordable generic medications

when they can, they sometimes must prescribe high cost medicines. In the first half of 2009, Becky has placed

800 orders for 385 patients for a total of \$539,726 worth of medications.

"One of the joys of my job is getting to meet and know the patients. They are inspiring and their stories are often humbling. One of the most amazing people I know is a lady who works at a local thrift store. This woman lives alone, has no car, no phone and gets by on a very modest income. Her fee is \$20 and yet she always pays us \$50. Recently, she brought us a card and inside was her entire tax refund...\$350. She's truly a remarkable soul." - Becky Eagle

Faith Family collaborates with two local partners in the delivery of medication. Faith Family works with the Siloam Family Clinic to share the cost of the prescription assistance program software. Faith Family also utilizes the Dispensary of Hope in providing sample medication to fill the gap before their medicine arrives from the pharmaceutical companies.

> Has Becky's experience with this kind of work changed her? "Yes", she says. "Look at me. I'm just one person who started volunteering one evening a week. Now I spend my days helping our patients by ordering life-saving medicine for them." Becky has learned that compassion, love and perseverance

are what matter most when helping the patients at Faith Family Medical Clinic. "This is hard work," Becky adds, "but I've been blessed to be here. It's some of the best care you can get and I love being a part of it."



Jerry Carmack

Jerry Carmack is a self-employed construction worker. He first found his way to Faith Family through the advice of a friend. In 2006, he started to develop some troubling symptoms. Even so, he put off going to the doctor, dreading the diagnosis. Finally, he met with Dr. Henderson, who referred him to a physician at Saint Thomas, who confirmed that Jerry had cancer.

After a total of seven surgeries and eight courses of chemotherapy, Jerry celebrated his last treatment on July 5, 2007. To date, all follow up tests have shown him to be cancer-free.



Like so many other Faith family patients, Jerry has been touched by the Clinic's personalized care. "They know my name when I walk in the door," he says. "I've never had a bad experience there. Very few places care about their patients as much as Faith Family does."

Meet Our Specialists

In addition to the dedicated staff of doctors, physician assistants and nurse practitioners who provide the primary care to our patients at the clinic, Faith Family is blessed to have an "extended family" of physician specialists who we can call upon when our patients need specialized advice and treatment. These specialists either donate their services or provide them at a deeply discounted rate in order to help us meet our mission of providing affordable and comprehensive healthcare to the working uninsured in Middle Tennessee.

We'd like to introduce you to one of these generous specialists, Dr. Harrison Shull.

Dr. Harrison Shull, M.D.

Dr. Harrison Shull has been a practicing gastroenterologist in Nashville for 30 years. About five years ago, he met Dr. Tom Henderson and learned of the Faith Family mission. The vision of the clinic appealed to him, and he volunteered to see patients whenever needed.

Ever since then, Faith Family Clinic has referred an average of one or two patients a week to him. He describes the patients as "extremely interesting and rewarding." "When they come to me, they have a clear need in the area I see," he

explains, "and they are so grateful for what we do for them. It also gives me the opportunity to work with truly spiritually-based physicians at Faith Family." Clinically, he sees a broad range of illnesses among the Faith Family patients and almost all respond well to treatment. "This is a very

good, strong, responsible group of patients," Dr. Shull adds. "By and large, you can count on them to keep their appointments and do all they can to get tests done and follow through with their medications."

Each patient seen by Dr. Shull has been pre-screened by Faith Family staff to determine what they can afford to pay for their specialist care. Everyone pays something, which gives them the sense that they are partnering with their medical team and that their care is not somehow different.

"In some respects, working with patients from Faith Family is one of the best parts of my practice," says Dr. Shull. "These patients sometimes give me a level of satisfaction that I don't find with the traditional patient population. They don't have the resources to interface with traditional healthcare delivery services. As they get better, it's very rewarding for me and for them."
