NEWS FROM THE CLINIC

The clinic was chosen as one of 10 recipients nationally for the American Medical Association's Nutrition Grant. The clinic was also chosen as one of 19 organizations to receive Project Diabetes funding from the State of Tennessee.

Faith Family held the annual Volunteer Appreciation Luncheon on April 18th. More than 25 volunteers joined staff at the clinic and enjoyed a thank you lunch.

In continued partnership with Nashville Songwriters Association International, the Bluebird Café hosted a songwriter night on May 17th and August 16th to benefit Faith Family, as well as a Tin Pan South show on March 29th. Faith Family continues to serve working musicians without health insurance in the Nashville area.

The Journey to Health program now offers Smoking Cessation classes and Weight Watchers meetings. Additionally, a monthly speaker series will feature talks on various health topics.

Meet Our Patient: Barbara Adams

Barbara Adams has a long family history of deadly heart disease; her brother suffered a major heart attack at 42, and her mother died at 57 from a heart attack. Barbara was aware of her dangerous family history, but when her husband passed away in 2005, she had no way of receiving medical care. She had previously Barbara Adams and Physician Assistant, Carolyn Pratt relied on her husband's insurance and



had been a home maker her whole life. Following his death Barbara found work in a retail setting, but insurance was not offered by her employer. She went without medical care until an aunt told her about Faith Family.

Barbara made her first appointment and saw a Faith Family Medical Clinic staff Physician Assistant, Carolyn Pratt. During the routine clinical exam, Barbara noticed Carolyn taking her blood pressure several times. When Barbara asked, Carolyn explained that her blood pressure was close to 200/100, a dangerously high level. Carolyn then listened to Barbara's arteries, and immediately ordered additional tests. continued on page 3 >

Dr. John W. Lamb



After the test results came back, it was clear that Barbara had a very serious condition that required immediate attention. The main artery in her heart was 99% blocked, which was the very same condition known as the "widow maker" that caused the death of her mother. Ms. Pratt made arrangements for Barbara to see a cardiologist and vascular surgeon who would perform the surgery at little charge. In January Barbara received 2 stents in her abdominal aorta, and in February she received an additional 7 stents in her heart.

Barbara says she is alive today because of the grace of God and Faith Family Medical Clinic. "Everyone at Faith Family is so sweet and knowledgeable," she explains, "I have had no fear through any of this."

Each year, Faith Family Medical Clinic receives donations from the very patients we serve. These gifts are often humbling, and speak to the character of the many individuals that walk through our doors each day. An individual may be struggling financially and unable to afford health insurance, but still willing to donate in order to help others like themselves. This powerful gesture reinforces the mission of Faith Family, and paints a picture of the impact our services have on the patients we treat.

Since the clinic's opening in October 2001, Faith Family patients have given the clinic \$72,127. The donations come steadily throughout the year, ranging in amount from \$1 to \$3,000. Often a donation will come with a note of appreciation, other times a gift may be in the form of cash, a few dollars spared while a patient checks out and pays their bill. Faith Family never expects patients to donate, but the generosity says volumes about the level of appreciation our patients have for the services they receive.
