Position Description:

- RN licensure (TN) (if applicable).
- Authorization in TN to practice family health by the Board of Nurse Examiners or The National Commission on Certification of Physician Associates.
- Must hold current licensure/registration to practice.
- Prescriptive authorization.
- Experience providing primary care as a Family Nurse Practitioner or Physician Associate.
- Proficiency with medical instruments and equipment required to perform your work.

- Knowledge of computer-based data management programs and information systems, as well as medical records and telehealth platforms.
- A sound understanding of all pertinent federal and state regulations, including HIPPA and OSHA.
- Knowledge of disease prevention.
- Knowledge of quality care standards and measures that prevent gaps in care.
- Ability to maintain highly confidential information.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- Prescribe medication, examine patients, diagnose illnesses, and provide treatment.
- Order, interpret, and evaluate diagnostic tests.
- Gather health histories, perform physical examinations and diagnostic procedures.
- Develop and implement treatment plans.
- Document patient histories and symptoms.
- Create patient care plans and contribute to existing ones.
- Administer medicine and other treatments.
- Train patients and families to manage and prevent illness and injury.
- Dictate and document all patient interactions.
- Notify managing physician about unusual or unexpected events or problems.
- Effectively communicate with diverse populations, including physicians, employees, patients, and families.
